About the Judges



Antonio Hudtwalcker (Spring Classic) The Hudtwalcker family started breeding in 1979. They have bred multiple national champion mares in Peru and US, and many times 1st place with various mares in the Peruvian Nationals. Tony is the youngest judge on the "A" list of judges. He has judged in Ecuador, Panama, Honduras, Guatemala, US, Peru, Canada, Argentina, and has judged the National Show in the US and the Centroamericano. His priorities in judging are Pisos, as well as arrogance and brio.



Luis "Lucho" Dapelo (Pacific Coast)

The Dapelo family are prominent breeders of Peruvian horses and founders of the National Association in Lima, Peru. Lucho is the third generation in his family to breed and train Peruvian horses. He showed horses at the national level until he left Peru for the United States with his family's horses over 25 years ago. Lucho has been showing and breeding Peruvian horses in the U.S. since he arrived. He is also active in judging horse shows and giving seminars. Lucho and his wife Jeanelle breed and train Peruvian horses at their Pecan Valley Ranch in Weatherford, Texas.



Rolando Garcia (Grand Championship) Senior Garcia has been breeding Peruvian Paso horses for over 20 years. He has been "Best National Breeder" several times and was the first non-Peruvian Paso judge recognized by the ANCP CPP. He is a recognized judge by all Central America associations. General Information

Rules

The SCPPHC shows are operated in accordance with the current official RULES AND REGULATIONS OF HORSE SHOWING AND PERUVIAN PASO BREED STANDARDS of the NORTH AMERICAN PERUVIAN HORSE ASSOCIATION. Every person who participates in the show is responsible for a knowledge of, and are subject to these NAPHA rules. Rule books may be obtained at www.napha.net

Registry Requirements

Horses to be shown must be registered with the North American Peruvian Horse Association (former PPHRNA or AAOBPPH) or the Peruvian Horse Association of Canada .

Male Horses

Please remember all male horses, shown in any bit class must provide registration papers indicating Stallion or Gelding, as outlined in NAPHA rules.

STALLIONS 4 & over **MUST** be registered as Breeding Stallions to be shown in stallion bit classes. The only exception to this rule is a male horse 4 yrs of age being shown in Bozal.

Judges

If, for any reason, a judge fails to attend this show or perform his or her duties, the Show Committee reserves the right to substitute that judge with another qualified judge. It is a violation of the NAPHA rules to commit any act or make remarks during the show that are considered offensive and/or made with intent to influence or cast aspersions on the judging. No one shall approach a judge with regards to a decision, or at any time without first obtaining permission from the Show Manager or Steward who shall arrange an appointment with the judge at a proper time and place.

Discipline

Exhibitors are warned that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the officials of this show on the part of an owner, trainer, groom, rider or handler will disqualify the horse or rider from adjudication. The management reserves the right to remove horse, owner, trainer, groom, rider or handler from the show without being liable for compensation or damages.

Protests

Should any questions or disputes arise, they must be protested in the manner prescribed by the NAPHA Show Rules.

Admission to the Ring

No person will be permitted to enter the ring except class participants, the judge, their assistants and show officials. Attendants and grooms may enter the ring when summoned by order of the judge.

SCPPHC Year – End Points

Points will only be awarded to horses whose owners are members of SCPPHC at the time of the show. **Juniors must also be members for annual awards.**

Feed

There is some feed available for purchase, but you can bring your own feed .

Bedding

Complementary first bedding of one bag of shavings provided with each stall housing a horse. Extra shavings can be ordered from the Barn Manager prior to the show.

General Information

Entries

Entries must be submitted on the official entry form. No entry will be accepted unless accompanied by a valid check or money order for all appropriate fees. Copies of the current registration papers for each horse must be included with the entry form and check.

Refunds - Valid, written veterinary excuse required for refunds!

Pre-entered horses: Class and stall fees refundable. The office fee & drug test fee are NOT refundable.

At show: Refunds for pre-entered classes ONLY, if the horse has not entered them. Refund for subsequent classes if Judge has excused a horse for lameness,

Substitutions

If a horse is entered by Sept. 9 but then is unable to perform, another horse may be substituted at no additional fee.

Pre-entered classes - a different class may be substituted for one already entered, for the same horse only.

Identification Numbers

Every horse entered in the show will be assigned an identification number which must be worn by the rider or handler.

Returned Checks

There will be a \$35 penalty if a check is returned by the bank.

Tack Changes -Three Minute Rule

The 3 minute rule will be enforced, which means that 3 minutes after the first horse in a class enters the ring, the gate will be closed and judging will begin. If additional time is needed, the entrant must notify the gate person prior to the final class call, an additional 5 minute extension can be granted.

Barn Area Parking

There shall be no parking of cars or trailers in the barn area, except credentialed officials and show employees. It is the responsibility of LICENSEE to ensure that this policy is enforced, or there will be a charge for LAEC to provide parking control personnel during the EVENT.

Smoking

Smoking is prohibited on the LAEC grounds. LAEC is part of the city of Los Angeles park system and the city of Los Angeles forbids smoking on the premises.

Dogs

Dogs must be on a leash at all times, and are not allowed in seating areas of arenas, or in food and beverage areas prohibited by any applicable regulations. It is the responsibility of LICENSEE to ensure that this policy is enforced, or there will be a charge for LAEC to provide animal control personnel during the EVENT.

SPECIAL SHOW AWARDS

Through the years, special awards have been established for specific classes or shows sponsored by the SCPPHC.

The **Spring Classic Championship Show** has one special award.

The Vivienne Lundquist Memorial Trophy is awarded to the Champion of Champions Breeding Stallion. Vivienne was involved with Peruvian Horses for more than 20 years as a large breeder who produced many top horses. She was very active in breed promotion and a big supporter of the SCPPHC as well as our national organization.

The **Pacific Coast Championship show** has three special awards:

Mel Harmon Memorial Trophy - Class 26

This award is given to the winner in the Peruvian Attire Class. Mel Harmon was one of the founders and supporters of this club, and was very active in the breed in the early years.

Mel Long Memorial Trophy

This special trophy is awarded to the overall High Point Junior of this show in honor of Mel Long who was a big supporter of the junior program and was an early founder of the club.

Stuart and Suzy Hamblen Memorial Trophy—High Point Horse of Show

Stuart Hamblen was a songwriter, storyteller and entertainer, as well as having run for President of the United States. With his wife, Suzy, he was a long-time breeder and promoter of the Peruvian Paso Horse.

The **Grand Championship Show** has three special awards:

The Stella Long Memorial Trophy—High Point Specialty Horse

These Specialty Classes are Champagne, Sidesaddle, English/Plantation, and Western. Stella Long was one of the founders of the SCPPHC and this award was donated by her daughters. This award will be given only to the high point winner in the Grand Championship show. These classes will be judged by all three judges and awarded ribbons and 1st place trophies in the three shows. The classes that qualify are 25, 30, 37, 59.

The Leonard & Sandy Blankenship Award—Class 60

The saddle equitation class is offered to all junior members (age 17 & under) as a combined class, with one winner in each show. This class counts toward High Point Junior awards in both age groups for the three shows. There is a special trophy for this class for the winner in the Grand Championship Show. There are regular class awards given for the other two shows.

Califa MSR Memorial Trophy—Class 31

This is a new award given to the winner of the gelding gait class. This award will be given each year at the Grand Championship show in memory of Califa MSR, one of the most awarded geldings in the breed, known for his outstanding gait. This award is presented by Howard Tuttle, Marna Pearson, and the Salinas Family.

Notes & Class Descriptions

Amateur Classes and High Point and Reserve Awards

Riders showing in any Amateur class must have a Declaration of Amateur Status on file with NAPHA. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor (not the show office) to have this form signed in advance of entering any Amateur classes. If this is not completed, you may be required to forfeit any winnings and awards. Forms are available in the show

office. These classes are judged as performance classes. Each show will honor the show high point and reserve high point Owner/Amateur with a special award.

Halter Classes

For the safety and welfare of our younger horses, halter classes will have as little gaiting as possible. It is suggested that gaiting be limited to one time around the arena in each direction. More gaiting may be needed in the case of a run-off. This will ensure these classes are less stressful for our youngest horses, yet still provide the opportunity for them to be exposed to the show ring. Horses must be handled and shown throughout the entire class by one and the same person. To be judged: 45% on conformation; 30% on gait and collection; 20% on brio; 5% on condition.

Breeding Division Under Saddle

To be judged: 41% on gait; 27% on conformation; 27% on brio and temperament; 5% on condition.

Bozal Classes

The same horse may not be shown in both the bit and Bozal at the same show. To be judged: 40% on gait; 35% on conformation; 20% on brio and temperament; 5% on condition.

Gait Classes

To be judged 100% on gait.

Equitation

To be shown at a walk and best gait both ways of the ring. Riders should convey the impression of effective and easy control. To show the horse well, the rider should show his or herself to the best advantage. A complete picture of the whole is of major importance. No ponchos are allowed. Rider must use one hand (left), with other arm and hand at his/her side. No fingers through the reins.

Performance Classes

Open to mares, stallions and geldings. Horses must have reached the age of four to compete in this section and will be shown as a finished horse in the bit. To be judged: 60% on performance, brio, suitability and manners; 20% on gait and smoothness; 20% on condition.

Mel Harmon Peruvian Attire Class

This class is a luxury/breeding division class and qualified for Luxury and Breeding Championships. Full Peruvian Attire is required. This includes Peruvian spurs and a pellen. Ponchos are also required - no jackets for this class. To be judged: 30% gait and collection; 30% appointments; 20% brio; 15% condition; 5% manners

Notes & Class Descriptions

Junior Classes

Offered for riders 17 and under. Bareback pads are required for all junior riders in bareback classes. Helmets must be worn by all juniors 12 and under, and are recommended for the older juniors to provide a greater degree of protection.

Novice Classes and High Point

These classes are offered for our Novice Riders. This is for the first-time show rider who has never won more than 3 blue ribbons in a riding class at an SCPPHC sponsored show. A High Point Award will be given to the rider that accrues the most points in the 3 novice classes. Note* If a novice rider exhibits in any "amateur" classes then a Declaration of Amateur Status" must be on file with NAPHA.

Owner to Ride Class

Whoever is listed on the horse's registration papers and their **minor** children may ride in the Owner to Ride Class.

Specialty Classes (Sidesaddle, Western, English/Plantation & Champagne)

These classes will be judged as performance classes. Tack and attire of horse and rider must match.

Sidesaddle to be judged: 75% manners, gait, and performance, 25% appropriate attire
Western/English/Plantation to be judged: 40% performance, 15% manners, 15% gait and collection, 15% brio, 15% tack and attire

Champagne/Perrier to be judged: 100% on quantity remaining in the champagne glass

Special Tack Exception for this show

A Side Saddle of appropriate type may be used by a female rider of at least 13 years of age in any bit class. A Side Saddle will not be allowed in a Bozal class. A white (or of a color to coordinate with outfit) safety apron that covers the stirrup leg to the ankle is required.

Special Alternative Attire for Amateur, Open Performance, & AOTR Performance Classes

The SCPPHC will be allowing alternative attire for their Performance classes! This is NOT mandatory, rather an option for those who want to try something other than the white attire. NAPHA rules must be followed.

- ◆ Hat must be of Peruvian style as outlined by NAPHA rules.
- ◆ Blazer or suit-style vest MUST be worn. Bolero jackets ok. No ponchos.
- ◆ Boots & belts in colors and type as currently outlined in NAPHA rules.
- ◆ Boots allowed to be worn outside of pants.
- ◆ Colors allowed include black, shades of grey, brown (dark to tan/beige, khaki), shades of muted greens (olive to hunter), blues (light to dk. navy), burgundies (no bright reds/pinks), white, creams, ivory, NO BLUE DENIM, small pinstripes for jackets acceptable per NAPHA rules
- ◆ Slacks/pants must be long enough to cover ankle and boot tops.
- ◆ Split skirts or sidesaddle aprons for women as outlined in NAPHA rules.

Notes & Class Descriptions

Championship Classes
